Forest Health

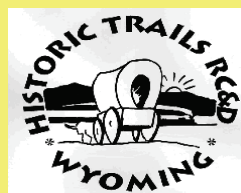
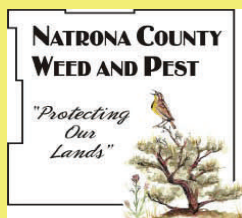
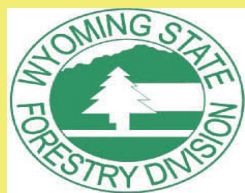
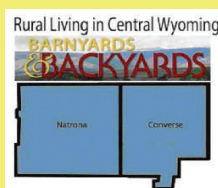
June 8, 2011, 9 am—2 pm
